California's Healthcare Staffing Crisis

The COVID-19 pandemic has produced the most serious crisis in healthcare in more than 100 years. Even before the pandemic, California faced a massive shortage of healthcare workers needed to care for our aging population. Fighting the pandemic has left healthcare workers exhausted, leading many to leave the industry and creating a full-blown healthcare worker shortage.

SEIU-UHW members believe this shortage and the resulting patient care crisis is best solved when healthcare employers, local and state governments, and frontline healthcare workers are able to work in concert to confront the unprecedented challenges we face. A key first step is to understand the extent of the shortage and its impact on patient care, as seen through the eyes of those closest to it: frontline healthcare workers.

About This Report Card

This report card presents the results of a six-week survey of 163 healthcare workers at STANFORD UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER conducted by SEIU–United Healthcare Workers West from March 14 – April 22, 2022. Statewide, a total of 33,081 healthcare workers participated in the survey from 199 hospitals.

The bilingual (English/Spanish) survey featured questions related to staffing at the respondent's healthcare facility and asked each respondent to answer based on their experiences on the job during the past year. Respondents completed the survey either electronically or on paper.












How often do you feel forced to skip breaks or meals?




How often do you feel like you lack the proper amount oftime to dedicate to a patient or assigned task?


Ignored/Skipped Safety Protocols


ey Have you felt pressured to ignore or skip safety protocolsbecause of short staffing?




Delays/Denials of Patient Care


Survey Have you seen or heard of care being delayed or denied as a Question result of short staffing?


Raised Short Staffing Concerns




